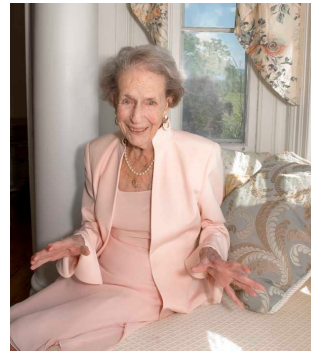

Into the New Year

As members of the board of directors of the Robert H. Mollohan Family Charitable Foundation launch into a new year, we are doing so without the guidance of our late president Helen Holt Mollohan. Since its inception ten years ago, Mrs. Mollohan offered wisdom and guidance as the Foundation provided community grants and scholarships in West Virginia amounting to more than \$1.1 million.

In discussions at our annual meeting, the nonagenarian Mrs. Mollohan emphasized that changing times and technological innovations require an increasingly educated citizenry.

She noted that post-secondary education, whether in college or technical school, is not a luxury but a necessity.

“When my husband, Bob Mollohan, and I were beginning our married life, a college educa-

tion was far less critical than it is today,” she explained. “Those days are gone. Where once a bachelor’s degree was a goal of young people, a master’s or beyond is now often required in our fast-changing world.

“In the ten years of the Foundation’s operation, it has been my pleasure to see so many young people receive financial aid and communities benefit from assistance for vital programs. From Ohio to Mingo counties, the imprint of the Mollohan Foundation is seen and will continue to be visible for a growing and vital West Virginia.”

2011 Scholarship Recipients Selected

Each year the Mollohan Foundation awards a number of West Virginia high school seniors and rising college students scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$10,000. The applicants are scored based not only on academics, but also their extra curricular activities,

community involvement, and their educational achievements.

The Foundation currently offers eleven different scholarships focusing on, but not limited to business, technology, art, aviation, and education.

Community Outreach Grants Awarded

The following grants were awarded by the Mollohan Foundation's Committee on Community Outreach in January for the fourth quarter, 2010:

East Fairmont High School—\$1,000 to help purchase Apple iPod touches and a mobile cart which will be used in a number of the high school's classrooms. This device will house applications for vocabulary, SAT/ACT preparation, Calculus, Physics, the periodic table, and History.

Family Leadership First—TEAM for West Virginia Children—\$5,000 will go toward the organization's multi-day conference at Canaan Valley Resort, which is provided free

of charge to families from all over West Virginia that are selected to attend. The conference brings a wonderful mix of families together where they not only learn about important family issues, but also gives families time to spend together.

The Arc, Ohio County Chapter—\$5,000 which will be used toward the organization's six week summer camp. The camp is designed to provide a structured setting to enhance basic skills, communications, social interaction, creativity, physical development for students between the ages of 6 and 21 who have been diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Through the contributions of not only the Mollohan Foundation, but individuals and

various organizations alike, no child will be turned down for the opportunity to attend this camp.
